MESSAGE FROM THE TREASURER

Think Globally, Act Locally - That is a motto which many conservationists say we all should put into practice. I know many of you are enthusiastic about conservation. Here are things we can easily do right here at Meadow Hill.

Our utility bills continue to rise. As I have been reviewing and paying our electric bills this past year, I have noticed a trend. Our usage (the meter amount) has continued to go up for some of our garages. As much as 30% to 50% for some buildings. This could amount to \$15 per month for the 10 buildings where I have seen increases, or \$1800 per year. This is a common charge which we all share. My thought is that lights inside our garages are being left on for extended periods of time. And they are probably old incandescent bulbs as well.

If we could replace the old bulbs with LEDs and make sure we turn them off when we leave, I think we could save a good portion of that \$1800.

For that matter, if we could save 3% of our \$113,500 budgeted utility charges, that would be \$3405.00.

Other ideas which I'm sure most of you have heard of are:

- ✓ Fix leaky faucets; limit use by not running when using for dishes, brushing teeth etc.; take shorter showers to save on our water and sewer usage. Water is a common charge for all.
- ✓ Be sure to turn off lights that you turn on in the clubhouse and Hollister House. And return thermostat settings back after using the two buildings.
- ✓ Make sure only recyclables are placed into blue bins. Allwaste will charge us more if we mix refuse with recyclables. There is a guide for acceptable items available.

Let's all try to save a little more. Having \$3000 - \$4000 more for amenities and activities could be enjoyed by all! Larry Abbott, Meadow Hill Treasurer

POOL UPDATE



The pool reconstruction is on schedule. If you haven't seen it, the new concrete deck has been poured. Four new skimmers, tile, ladders, hand rail, handicapped lift footings and two new LED pool lights have been installed. Due to the quickly approaching winter weather, the painting of the pool, installation of replacement fencing and shrubbery will be done in the spring. We are also investigating a new gate



and more secure access to the pool area. So, this major community project has made great progress, with some still to be done early next year. We are very pleased with the work done by Splash Pools and thank them for their professionalism.

Introducing Friends of the River



Friends of the River is an ad-hoc committee established by the Board of Directors 6 years ago. The mission statement describes why this committee exists: "Develop a responsible and consistent system of management and stewardship of Meadow Hills' most valuable asset."

Toward that end, constant and consistent efforts have been used to try to control the invasive species that were taking over our wetlands. The

accomplishments to date are varied, with some being spectacular. Walking up from the river, you can see flowers spring and fall. While invasive species are a headache from Phragmites to dodder, they will require attention for a long time. An additional area of focus includes the improvements of value enhancements to the Meadow Hill community. For 2019, we plan to continue to implement our mission statement within available resources as approved in the budget.

Greenhouse Update

Good news! A new heater has been installed in the greenhouse to better protect our tender plants. If the temperature drops dangerously within the greenhouse, an outside light will give warning – a great new protection! If you use the greenhouse, remember to water your own plants.

When we expect cold temperatures and accumulating snow PLEASE

- Move your car away from the parking areas next to garages before the storm begins.
- Do not park in front of a garage door.
- Do not park in the three spaces in the island by the Clubhouse.
- Remove your entrance mat(s) they can be drawn into the snow blower and cause damage or shred your mat. After the storm ends, when plowing and snow blowing are completed, you may replace your entrance mat.
- Turn on roof-heating cables (if you have them) when snow begins to fall. They can be turned off when the roof is clear of snow. Use of the cables reduces the risk of you and/or Meadow Hill suffering ice damage.
- Arrange to have roof-heating cables turned on if you will be away during potentially snowy weather.
- In very cold weather open cabinet doors under sinks on outside walls to let in warmer air.
- On very cold nights let faucets drip to keep pipes from freezing.
- If you're able to do it, turn off the water valve to outside faucets.
- Don't forget to water plants in the greenhouse.
