SAFETY ALERT



Most of us are aware of reports of recent car break-ins and car thefts in Glastonbury. While not reported at Meadow Hill, we have read stories in the Courant, the Glastonbury Citizen and Glastonbury Facebook page, and broadly covered at a recent Town Council meeting about the rash of car thefts in town. Many thefts are the result of cars and garages left open and unlocked with valuables inside including key fobs, wallets and purses. The thieves work quickly, in one instance stealing a car while residents were taking groceries into the house. Not to panic anyone but let's be smart - residents are encouraged to keep garage doors closed, cars locked and not leave valuables in the car. And certainly, be sure to call 911 to report any suspicious activity. We are, after all a community that looks out for one another.


LARK SURVEY RESULTS

Here are some comments to more fully explain our current/future goals:

- Many MH residents are already well versed in use of the quarterly, online Glastonbury Senior Center Sharing
 Tree and therefore don't need The Lark to repeat that information. We will tone down coverage of Senior
 Center and Library events but always include the link to the Sharing Tree.
