

#### **Some Winter Rules Reminders**



As we move into the cool weather and spend more time indoors, it's a good time to review some of the Meadow Hill rules that have been put in place to help keep us safe. Here is a summary of SOME key rules; it is recommended you access the full text of the Rules document, found in the right navigation bar on the Meadow Hill Home Page, or through your Pilera account.

**High Risk Components** – Be sure you understand all the rules around high-risk components to provide safety for all. These include your responsibilities with, maintenance of, and restrictions with:

Chimneys and Fireplaces

Gas or electric fireplace logs

Smoke and carbon Monoxide detectors

Water Heaters

Washing machine hoses and valves

**Dryer Vent cleaning** 

**Greenhouse** - Users of the greenhouse next to the barn are responsible for maintaining it in a neat, clean and orderly manner. Up to FIVE plants (per household) are to be labeled with the owner's name, and watered/cared for by the owner/designated person. Plants infected with diseases are to be removed. And please refill the watering container after your use.

**Winter unit vacancy** – For those who get away during the winter months (Nov.1 to Apr.1) and leave the unit vacant, the unit owner is responsible to:

- Maintain heat at no less than 60 degrees within the unit
- Ensure the unit is properly winterized and the water shut off at the main
- Arrange for regular inspections of the unit at least once every two weeks to ensure there are no problems
- Inform Darien Covert, Superintendent of all extended vacancies

**Snow predicted** – Parking in front of garages by any vehicle is prohibited when snow is expected, falling or on the ground and until parking lots are cleared. Also, when snow or ice is on the ground or expected, no door mats may be left on the sidewalks, stoops or steps at any exterior door.

#### **Make a Connection**



Did you know that, according to recent research, just 8 hours of social isolation has the same immediate, dramatic impact on your energy levels and mood as going 8 hours without food? Dr. Vivek Murthy, Surgeon General, declared loneliness a national health emergency. A marked increase in depression and anxiety, as well as heart disease, dementia and premature death have been associated with this problem of social isolation.

Reflecting on this, I can see the value of a community like Meadow Hill, where often neighbors see each other outdoors walking or gathering at the end of day at a bench overlooking the river. But the upcoming colder months can be a hardship when social isolation becomes hard to bear. Some of this isolation is due to the aging population and sometimes physical or mental disabilities. We're grateful for the effort made at Meadow Hill to gather us together for special events, but the normal everyday routine can feel lonely.

Another concern for some is having something on our mind and wishing to talk to someone who will just listen or give appropriate feedback if asked. Friends or family may just not be the right fit. As a skilled listener with life experience who treasures our community, let me know if you'd like to set up a confidential one-on-one meeting. 

## **Property Tax Relief for Seniors**



The State of CT and the Town of Glastonbury provide property tax credits for senior citizens whose primary residence is Glastonbury. The tax credits, which are calculated by formula can be up to \$1250 and are credited against your property tax bill.

To qualify for the credits, a resident's income may not exceed HUD guidelines. For example, in 2023 your income could not exceed \$53,400. The guidelines are revised annually for cost-of-living adjustments and are likely to be higher in 2024. Qualified applicants must apply between February 1st and May 15th.

If you think you may qualify and would like to know more about the program, contact Kathy Proulx at 585-474-6699. If enough people are interested, the town's social services department would be willing to meet here with residents to discuss the program and answer questions. By David Hogan
